

Dear Students,



In the pious land of "Kathgarh Mahadev" Govt. College Indora is situated at Village Indora which is 18 k.m. from Pathankot (Punjab) and 10 k.m. from Mirthal NH-1A. The college was established by the Govt. of H.P. in the year 1995 and started functioning by sharing the building of G.S.S.S. Indora. The college got its own newly constructed well-furnished and well -equipped three storey building in the year 2008.

The college is a co-educational institution affiliated to H.P. University Shimla. College offers bachelor degree in various major subjects in Languages, Humanities, Commerce and Science, Since the college is situated in the border area of Punjab, so it not only caters to the need of higher education to the students of Himachal Pradesh but also attracts a large number of students from Punjab.

In Physical resources college has 6 lecture theaters, 15 class rooms, 2 Physics Laboratories. 2 Chemistry Laboratories, a Botany Laboratory, a Zoology Laboratory, a Hi-tech Computer Laboratory, a Geography Laboratory and a Language Laboratory with all modern facilities, The college has a examination hall with the sitting capacity of two hundred students. In the Department of Physical Education College has a Table-Tennis Hall, a Gymnasium, a Badminton Court, Wrestling and Judo Mats and a large well maintained playground for the students. The college also has well-furnished girls hostel which offers accommodation to 105 girls students of the college.

The College has updated library with the stock of more than 7000 books on its shelves and subscribes for all major journals, magazines and newspapers. The college has a smart class room for the better understanding of the concepts with the help of audio-visual aids.

In Human resources, a team of well qualified 19 teachers and 15 non-teaching members is dedicated for students under the able guidance and leadership of College Principal Prof. Rai Kumar Jamwal. The college is excelling not only in academics but also in sports and co-curricular activities. Our college is the winner of H.P.U. inter-college judo championship 2017-18 with 6 gold medals (one by Atul, Akashdeep, Deepak, Jobandeep Singh, Anil Sarmal and Ajay) and 2 bronze medals (one by Munish and one by Sapna). In H.P.U. inter-college wrestling championship 2017-18 our students performed well. Balram, Rahul, Pooja, Pallavi Katoch, Kirti and Sapna bagged bronze medal in this championship. Our college students participated in inter-college weightlifting championship and Sharmila won bronze medal in this championship. For the very first time our college students have been selected for various water sports and represented H.P.U. in all India inter-university Kyaking and Canoeing championship organised by G.N.D.U. Amritsar at Pong Dam. Our students Alka, Kirti, Ruhi and Priya participated in this championship. It was a proud moment for our college when Balram won silver medal and Ruhi and Alka won bronze medals in all India inter-university yachting championship. Priya's participation in this championship is also commendable. This was the very first achievement due to the efforts of our students that H.P.U. won overall 2nd runners-up trophy in all India inter-university yachting championship. One of our college student Sandeep won silver medal in inter-college athletic championship. Atul, Ajay, Deepak, Anil Sarmal, Akashdeep and Jobandeep have also participated in all India inter-university Judo championship held at P.U. Chandigarh.

The college has a NSS unit of 100 active volunteers and a unit of Rangers & Rovers. The college has constituted various clubs and societies which includes Red Ribbon Club, Eco Club, Science Club and Commerce Society. "Healthy mind lives in a healthy body" keeping in view this thought the college encourages students to participate in various sports activities. In addition to regular courses from Himachal Pradesh University, the college also has IGNOU study centre which offers undergraduate, post graduate and certificate courses in various subjects.

ADMISSION TO THE B.A./B.SC./B.COM IST YEAR WILL TAKE PLACE AS PER THE DIRECTIONS OF H.P. GOVT.

OUTLINE OF CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (FOR SEM. III-VI ONLY)

A Student under three year degree course (under CBCS) shall study the following courses.

1. Discipline Specific Core (DSC) Course (12) (4 discipline specific papers each for regular courses and 2 papers each for English and Hindi/MIL in B.A./B.Com.) : A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course.

2. Elective Course: Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

2.1 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course (2 Each for regular courses): Elective courses offered by the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. The University/Institute may also offer discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).

2.2 Dissertation/Project Work : An elective course of 6 credits, designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/support study to a project work, and a candidate studies such a course on his own with an advisory support by a teacher/faculty member is called dissertation/project work. A Project/Dissertation work may be given in lieu of a discipline specific elective paper.

2.3 Generic Elective (GE) Course (2 each for B.A./B.Com regular courses): An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure to other subjects/disciplines is called a Generic Elective Course. A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and vice versa and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective.

3. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC): The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses are of two kinds:

3.1 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC) (2) to be studied in first two semesters : AECC courses are based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement. These are mandatory for all disciplines.

(i) Environmental Science

(ii) English/Hindi/MIL Communication

3.2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) (Minimum 4): These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value -based and/or skill-based knowledge and should contain both theory and lab/handson/training/field work. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life-skills in hands-on mode so as to increase their employability.

4. Practical/tutorials: One each with every core and discipline/generic specific elective paper.

PS: An undergraduate degree in Science disciplines may be awarded if a student completes 4 core papers each in three disciplines of choice, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and 2 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective papers based on three disciplines of choice selected above, respectively.

An Undergraduate degree in Humanities/ Social Sciences/ Commerce may be awarded if a student completes 4 core papers each in two disciplines of choice, 2 core papers each in English and Hindi/MIL, respectively, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), 2 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective papers based on the two disciplines of choice selected above, respectively, and two papers from the list of Generic Electives papers.

EVALUATION SYSTEM:

All courses involve an evaluation system of students that has the following two components:

1. Continuous and Comprehensive Assessment (CCA): CCA will account for 30% for the total grade of the subject that include one mid term test of 15 marks after completion of 2/3rd of the syllabus and 10 marks will be awarded on the basis of seminar and other assignments taken by the course teacher and remaining 5 marks attributed to attendance as per following schedule:

4 marks ≥ 90% but < 95% 1 marks ≥ 75% but < 80% 5 marks ≥ 95% 2 marks

≥ 80% but < 85% 3 marks

2. End Semester Examination : End Semester Examination will account for 70% of the total grade of

- 13. Principal reserves the right to disallow any admission .
- 14. Students seeking exemption from tuition fee for disability must attach an attested copy of 40% disability certificate from Medical Board .
- 15. Only those candidates who have passed all the five papers including English from Netional Open School are eligible to take admission in semester - I.

ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS FOR ADMISSION

Age limit

An applicant must not be more than 23 years (25 rears for girls) of age as on 1st July of the year 2018 i.e. must not have been born earlier to 01-07-1995. Only the Vice Chancellor shall have the power of granting age relaxation up to a maximum of six months. For SC/ST students however the upper age limit is raised to three years.

Minimum pass percentage for admission in different faculties is given as:-

i)B.A.-I (Bachelor of arts)- 33%

A student seeking admission in B.A. I with mathematics as the subject of study should have either 45% marks in aggregate or 45% marks in mathematics at +2 level.

- ii) B.Com.-I (Bachelor of commerce)
- a)40% for those who have passed examination under commerce group at +2 level.
- b)33% for girls students.
- c)45% for others.
- d)For admission to B. Com. I the candidate must have passed maths/ economics as compulsory subjects with 45% marks at +2 level.
- iii)B.Sc.-I (Bachelor of science)- 45%

Candidate must have Physics, Chemistry and Biology / Mathematics as compulsory subject at +2 level.

There is relaxation of 5% marks for SC/ST students for admission to Science and Commerce faculties.

Students who are placed under compartment in any examination of any board shall not apply even for provisional admission in this college.

Admission to the Semester III & V of all the streams shall be on roll on basis.

IDENTITY CARD

Every student is issued an Identity card at the time of admission. Entry to the college premises without Identity card is prohibited / not allowed. It is obligatory for every student to produce the Identity card as and when demanded by the college authorities. In the event of loss of Identity card, students are advised to get duplicate Identity card on payment of ₹ 20/-. Duplicate Identity card will be issued to a student if he/she produces a copy of the F.I.R.

COLLEGE LIBRARY

The College Library has a collection of more than 7539 books on various subjects. About a dozen periodicals/journals and six newspapers are subscribed for the library. Rules of Library :-

- 1. At a time, only two books can be issued to a student for a period of 14 days. Delay in returning the books is fined @ ₹ 1/- per day per book.
- 2. Reference books will not be issued.
- 3. In case of any damage to the book, the student may be fined and also required to replace the book.
- The books will be issued only to Identity card holders.

HOSTEL FACILITY

College has hostel facility with well-furnished rooms for 35 students. Interested students can apply for accommodation at the time of admission.

LEAVE RULES FOR STUDENTS

Students are required to attend their classes regularly. The condition of prescribed attendance of lectures in order to be eligible to appear in University examination is mandatory. However, students can be granted leave up to 3 days on the recommendation of tutor incharge of his/her respective major subjects. Leave beyond three days on production of Medical Certificate or otherwise may be granted by the Senior tutor. The name of the student who remain absent without leave consecutively for six days will be struck off from the college rolls. He/She may seek re-admission within ten days after payment of re-admission fee ₹ 100/- on a prescribed performa. If the name of the student is struck off from the college rolls for second time re-admission will only be allowed in the presence of parents on recommendation of discipline committee after the payment of required fine and there after for the 3rd time no re-admission shall be allowed

ATTENDANCE

Eligibility for University Examination

a) In order to be eligible to appear in University Examination a student is required to attend atleast 75% lectures both in theory as well as in practical separately. However, the Principal may relax 15% lectures in respect of those student who could not attend classes on account of their participation in NSS, Sports or Cultural Activities.

ANNUAL PRIZE DISTRIBUTION FUNCTION

The college organizes Annual Prize Distribution Function at the end of the academic session, the date of which is notified well in advance. Various prizes are awarded to the students who show excellence in the field of Academics, Sports, Cultural Activities in order to encourage and motivate them.

Students standing First, Second & Third in aggregate in University Examination and in Mid Term Test are given prizes. Like wise, prizes are also awarded to the students on the basis of their performance in Sports, Cultural, NSS and other Co-curricular Activities.

TUTORIAL GROUPS

The students of the college are grouped in various tutorial groups constituted in the college. Each group holds its meeting as per schedule with prior intimation to students under the charge of Tutor. Students are advised to get their academic problems solved in the tutorial classes.

N.S.S.

National Service Scheme is a noble experiment in academic extension. It inculcates the spirit of voluntary work among the students and teachers through sustained community interactions. It shows how to combine knowledge and action to achieve results which are desirable for community development. The college has one unit of N.S.S. comprising 100 volunteers. The unit is engaged in regular and special camp activities under the supervision of its programme officer. The students may enrol themselves as per rules with in one month of their admission. The enrolment forms are available with the programme officer.

COLLEGE MAGAZINE

Every Year the College publishes the college Magazine "KARTIKA". It provides the students an opportunity to express their talent of writing skills. Students can give their articles to the respective section editor well in time.

CAREER GUIDANCE AND PLACEMENT CELL

A career guidance and placement cell has been setup in the college under the committee of teachers. The students are made aware of various career opportunities available to them. The career related literature and advertisement cuttings/clippings will be regularly displayed on the notice board of the cell. CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE RULES

Every student is required to maintain discipline and observe code of discipline inside & outside the college campus The following is the code of discipline for the students of this college. Any act of indiscipline will invite disciplinary
